OBIX LAUNCH

AN UPDATE FROM CONNECT CARE WOMEN'S HEALTH LEAD LORNA SPITZKE

On Wednesday, June 2nd, the Fort Saskatchewan Community Hospital (FSCH) Labour & Delivery program successfully launched the OBIX Perinatal Interface Software. "OBIX" is a software program enabling the display and recording of the Fetal Heart Rate. This system allows clinicians to easily monitor their obstetrical patients and record findings electronically, replacing our paper based Fetal Heart Rate monitoring systems. The OBIX system is being interfaced with Connect Care, creating a seamless workflow while caring for the obstetrical patient, in both a Labour and delivery unit as well as ambulatory setting. OBIX also supports remote viewing of the Fetal Heart Rate by AHS providers not at the bedside, greatly enhancing remote consultation support for obstetrical providers and their patients across Alberta. Jasmine Gaudet is the first obstetrical patient in Alberta to receive care with the aide of the OBIX system.

FSCH along with many other facilities across the province, are procuring OBIX through Hospital and Health Foundation support, helping advance the care of obstetrical patients across the province through this



advanced technology.
